
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SGSP Call for Applications 2020


The Call for Applications was open from 30 January 2020 to 10 May 2020. During this period, we received 172 applications in total, whereas 15 male applicants were disqualified at the very first stage of selection process (one of the eligibility requirements to apply to SGSP is to be a female resident in Azerbaijan).

The applicants' purpose in applying for the scholarship program varied based on the demonstrated need. As shown in the chart below, most of the girls applied to either further continue their studies or to use funds for various personal purposes:



Regional Distribution of the Applicants

In total, we have reviewed 157 application. Most of the applicants were from Baku (83), two of them presented their application from abroad, and the rest were from the different regions of Azerbaijan.



The SGSP Mentorship Program

2019. SGSP launched the In Mentorship Program. The goal of the program is to provide our young girls with mentors and to provide mentoring program structured capable of assisting mentees in their academic life and ideas, defining career goals and plans, supporting relevant and education/skills development needs.

Mentorship program provides new development opportunities for our scholarship winners. Along with educational and career development, girls can get real-life advice from experienced mentors. Communicating with professionals from different backgrounds and improves expertise mentees' communication skills and provides larger and a more valuable network for them.

When looking for a mentor we are looking for the people who enjoy giving back and having an impact on others' lives. This year we confirmed six mentors selected among nine submitted applications. Most of our mentors enjoy the experience and are open to learn from their mentees as well. This is an opportunity for them to have access to the next rising talents and take part in their progress.

RIPL (Rondine International Peace




Violence against women and girls is a complex social problem. It is a consequence of gender inequalities deeply rooted in the patriarchal norms and unbalanced power relations and it is a mechanism through which gender inequalities are established and maintained. Exposure to various forms of harm and life in fear prevents women to fully realize their own potentials, reducing their wellbeing, but also reducing their contribution to the development of the society. Therefore, prevention and elimination of all forms of violence against women and girls, is, from the perspective of both humanistic and development approaches, the responsibility of the whole society.

The Crowdfunding Campaign 2020

The two-month long campaign allowed us to collect, in total, **\$4,872.86** to fund the studies of young female students from Azerbaijan. The chart below indicates the distribution of donations by the amounts received from our individual supporters:



This year's collaboration with *RIPL (Rondine International Peace Lab)* has allowed us to accept donations even after the crowdfunding campaign ended. Hence, the total public donations for the year of 2020 has reached *\$5400.*

SELECTION PROCESS

The selection process of the scholarship recipients took place in three stages: **1**) *Initial review;* **2**) *External review;* **3**) *Interview.* Each stage of the selection process is described below.

Initial review

During this stage, the SGSP project team reviewed the 157

applications by assigning them into three categories: highest need, moderate need, lowest need. The criteria used for determining the level of need was based on an applicant's social and economic indicators as demonstrated in the application. After the initial review of all applications, the SGSP project team identified 63 applicants who advanced to the second stage.

External review

Four of the SGSP supporters and a member of our partner organization (RIPL) indicated commitment to help with the selection of the scholarship recipients. At this stage, the supporters were asked to read through applicants' short answer essays and identify applicants who demonstrate a) the highest need and b) a sense of purpose. As a result of the external review, the SGSP project team determined 35 finalists who made it through to the final stage.

Interview

At this stage, the SGSP project team scheduled a phone or a Skype interview with each finalist to get to know them better and ask questions that were not on the application form. As SGSP is a needs-based scholarship, the project team aimed to probe finalists further on how the scholarship fund is relevant to their needs. Upon careful deliberation, 6 Scholarship recipients were selected at the end of a four-day interview process.
