## ANNUAL REPORT

2022



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
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Shahla Garayeva Scholarship Program, founded in 2018, aims to advance the educational aspirations and goals of underrepresented young girls from Azerbaijan. Since 2018, every year we open a call of applications for a period of two-three months, allowing interested young girls to benefit from the scholarship program in the form of financial aid and the mentorship program.

Since the establishment of the SGSP, we have seen a steady increase in the number of scholarships awarded each year. Starting with 4 scholarships in 2018/2019, we have been able to the raise the number to 6 in 2019/2020 and 20 in 2020/2021. However, this year, we have reached a new milestone by awarding a total of **43** scholarships, the highest number we have given since the inception of SGSP.



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
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

was open for a two-month period of time. During this period, we received 194 applications in total, whereas 16 applicants (male candidates, not completed application forms) were disqualified at the very first stage of the selection process (one of the eligibility requirements to apply to SGSP is to be a young girl from Azerbaijan).

#### In total, we have reviewed 178 application.



The applicants' purpose in applying for the scholarship program varied based on the demonstrated need. As shown in the chart below, most of the applicants intended to use the scholarship funds to further continue their studies or for various personal expenses.

### SELECTION PROCESS 2022

The selection process of the scholarship recipients took place in three stages: 1) Initial review; 2) External review; 3) Interview. Each stage of the selection process is described below.

#### **Initial review**

During this stage, the SGSP project team reviewed the **178** applications by assigning them to three categories: highest need, moderate need, and lowest need. The criteria used for determining the level of need was based on an applicant's social and economic indicators as demonstrated in the application. After the initial review of all applications, the SGSP project team identified **119** applicants who advanced to the second stage.

#### **External review**

Three of the SGSP supporters and members of the Partner organisations indicated a commitment to help with the selection of the scholarship recipients. At this stage, they were asked to read through applicants' anonymized short answer essays and identify applicants who demonstrate a) the highest need and b) the highest motivation - sense of purpose. As a result of the external review, the SGSP project team determined **79 finalists** who made it through to the final stage.

#### Interview

At this stage, the SGSP project team scheduled a phone or Zoom interview with each finalist to get to know them better and ask questions that were not on the application form. As SGSP is a needs-based scholarship, the project team aimed to probe finalists further on how the scholarship fund is relevant to their needs. Upon careful deliberation, **35 scholarship recipients** were selected at the end of a six-day interview process and **8 more scholarship recipients** were chosen by a partner organisation - Red Heart Fund, **totaling the number of scholarship recipients of 2022 to 43**.

### THE MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

The Mentorship program within SGSP was established with the aim to support the early career and personal development of female awardees. According to the overall mentee feedback, the mentors' individual approach is a great advantage of the SGSP program. The response from mentees underlines that the continuous exchange with their mentors had a positive impact on determining their own position and on setting priorities for the near future.

The mentorship program was designed to be flexible in order to adapt to the awardee routine duties and family responsibilities to facilitate participation as much as possible. Moreover, the mentorship program helps to boost the networks of women and gives the opportunity to connect on basis of common interests within the community.


This year, we again managed to hold meeting а with our awardees and partner organisations on December 17. 2022. of The purpose the meeting was for the girls to get to know us, communicate and with other fellow exchange awardees, and also to inform them about new opportunities. Representatives of all three partner organisations - ACSNC, For Azerbaijan, and Red Hearts, and members of the Baku Community Space Team, who helped us organise this meeting, also participated in the meeting.

We believe that as the awardees get to know each other and learn and benefit from the experience of others, taking into account the other tools (mentorship, training) offered by the program, we can build a strong community in Azerbaijan that supports education, especially girls' education.



### CROWDFUNDING CAMPAIGN

The SGSP Crowdfunding Campaign 2022 was successful in raising a total of \$ 5136 to support the studies of young girls from Azerbaijan. Thanks to the collaboration with ACSNC (Azerbaijan Cultural Society Northern California), we received a total of 76 donations during the Crowdfunding Campaign, allowing us to give 8 scholarships. Fruitful collaborations have continued throughout the year: thanks to the Crowdfunding Campaign held by For Azerbaijan Fund, Red Hearts Foundation, and Anonymous Donor's support, we were able to provide 35 additional scholarships. The chart below indicates the distribution of donations by the campaigns and partnerships held.
